Before that, Edward worked as an assistant legal counsel at the PCA, where he helped to administer appointing authority requests as well as arbitrations involving States, State entities and private parties. Alongside his work at Fietta LLP, Edward serves as an Assistant Editor for the Journal of International Humanitarian Legal Studies.

Edward obtained his LLB from the Australian National University, graduating with First Class Honours and a Specialisation in International & Comparative Law.
